How to make an anti-wasp entrance tube:

1. Cut a length of corex



2. Wrap around a former, in this case a length of square wood and fix together with duck tape



3. Cut an entrance on one side



4. Drill air holes on the opposite side



How it works:

- Wasp smells entrance through the air holes so is attracted to there
- Wasp does not like entering a dark tube and will not learn that the new entrance has moved
- Bees will learn to use the ends of the tube for its entrance

Considerations:

- If bees cannot find the new entrances, cut the length of the tube down
- Ensure the entrance block is reduced

5. Attach the entrance to the entrance block with duck tape, ensure entrance holes line up
